2024-25 | REBEKAH RADTKE, SCHOOL OF INTERIORS

Rebekah Radtke is an Associate Professor in the School of Interiors at the University of Kentucky College of Design and a Chellgren Endowed Professor. Radtke's research investigates design pathways exploring sustainable climatic futures in the post-mining territories of Appalachia. She uses communitycentric co-design processes in support of climate-responsive communities in Southeastern Kentucky and communities worldwide. The impacts of her work are through international partnership development and research collaborations in post-extraction territories. Radtke collaboratively founded Global x Appalachia and Studio Appalachia to lead these endeavors which have been grant funded from entities including the National Endowment for the Arts, chronicled in articles, book chapters, and presented locally and internationally. In 2023, Global x Appalachia was recognized as a University of Kentucky Emerging Theme for Research. Her collaborative work more broadly includes pedagogical projects in China, design-build projects in Brazil, sustainability research in South Africa, community-activated interventions in Southeastern Kentucky and experiential learning design initiatives in Lexington, Ky. Her scholarship seeks to build transformative connections through impactful collaborations and bring interior design principles to a broader audience.





Mike McKay is an Associate Professor in the School of Architecture and a distinguished University Research Professor at the University of Kentucky College of Design. He received his Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Kentucky and Master of Architecture from Princeton University. As an artist and designer, his installations, paintings, and mixed media work have been exhibited in Europe and throughout the United States. McKay is a MacDowell Fellow. Previous projects range in scale from urban landscapes to installations and 2-dimensional work. Each contributes to an overall investigation of form in relationship to material assembly, space, and the phenomenon of perspective as constructed mediators of experience.

In alignment with the newly announced Research Priority Area of Materials Science, the aims and goals of this project were to hire new talent to expand softgoods expertise in the College of Design, acquire new equipment to support softgoods teaching and research, and to train faculty and students in this area of research. With the support of the IMPACT funds, which totaled \$92,158, the College of Design has made significant strides towards research focused on the intersection of design with textiles. Our vision for the SoftLab is one that encourages material testing, rapid prototyping, customization, and promotes forward-thinking implementation of materials to inspire and enable a new generation of students, faculty, designers, and material possibilities. In the past year, we have installed an 80" flat digital knitting machine, tufting and sewing equipment, assembly tools, and various other materials and textiles. As part of the award, numerous College of Design faculty also had the opportunity to attend the Knit Futures Symposium. Organized by faculty member, Jennifer Meakins, this event brought together academic and industry partners for a three-day program focused on the intersection of digital knitting and the built environment. 





FACULTY EXHIBITION HIGHLIGHT

Reparations: The Other Mies Archive

Leen Katrib. Lexington Art League, February 9 - March 29, 2024

This ongoing subversive archival project re-examines the history of modernist architect Ludwig Mies van der Rohe's design for the Illinois Institute of Technology's postwar campus expansion, which led to the strategic erasure of a primarily Black neighborhood in Chicago's South Side. Conceived as an archival apparatus, the installation deconstructs the official campus history and complicates the architect's legacy, which rarely diverges from a discussion about form and architectural ideology, by inviting visitors to peek into the material record that was necessarily suppressed to create the myth of a tabula rasa created by an "apolitical" architect intent on creating an "apolitical" architecture in the name of progress and higher education.

Complementing the archival apparatus in the main exhibition room is an informal pop-up archive that invites visitors to rummage through an in-progress collection of found, scanned, and produced historical materials on the expansion of another campus—the Auraria Campus that wiped out a Hispanic neighborhood in Denver in the 1970s. Led by Jacques Brownson, a former student of Mies van der Rohe at IIT, and a number of IIT graduates, the pop up archive contextualizes the lingering implications of Mies van der Rohe's master plan and curriculum at IIT on the American academic landscape at large by taking stock of his former students and secondgeneration disciples.

This long-overdue subversive turn on the historiography of Miesian modernism and the modern university invites visitors to a moment of critical self-reflection: how do we confront the expansion of higher education institutions when it comes at the expense of displaced communities of color whose suppressed histories have often been justified?
